The City Council of the City of Sulphur, Louisiana, met in regular session at its regular meeting place in the Council Chambers, Sulphur, Louisiana, on March 12, 2018 at 5:30 p.m., after full compliance with the convening of said meeting with the following members present:

DRU ELLENDER, Council Representative of District 1
DENNIS BERGERON, Council Representative of District 2
MELINDA HARDY, Council Representative of District 3

STUART MOSS, Council Representative of District 5

After the meeting was called to order and the roll called with the above result, prayer was led by Mrs. Ellender, followed by the reciting of the Pledge of Allegiance led by Mr. Coats.

The Chairman asked if there were any changes to the minutes of the previous meeting. With no changes made, motion was made by Mr. Moss seconded by Mrs. Hardy that the minutes stand as written. Motion carried unanimously.

The Chairman then asked if there were any changes to the agenda. Motion was then made by Mr. Moss seconded by Mr. Bergeron that item #2 be removed:

2. David Spicer, Sulphur High School Community Impact Program, to address Council.

Motion carried unanimously.

Motion was then made by Mr. Moss seconded by Mrs. Ellender that #12 be removed:

12. Resolution appointing a member to the Sulphur Municipal Fire and Police Civil Service Board to fill the unexpired term of Thomas Bourgeois.

Motion carried unanimously.

Motion was then made by Mr. Moss seconded by Mr. Bergeron that the agenda stand as amended. Motion carried unanimously.

The first item on the agenda is a presentation by Armed Forces Committee. The Committee presented a certificate to Winnard Young, Jr. and thanked him for his many years of service.

The next item on the agenda is a presentation by Chief Coats on speed bumps/humps. Chief Coats stated that with all the traffic congestion and traffic on cut-thru streets everyone is in a hurry and is speeding through our streets. He stated that there are a few solutions:

1. More boots on the ground
2. 2. Radar Trailer - \$5,000 for each trailer
3. 3. Roadway Graphic - \$1,500 for each graphic
4. Speed humps - \$600-\$800 for each hump

The next item on the agenda is a resolution supporting the proposition to renew a levy and collect an ad valorem tax of 6.95 mills on all property subject to taxation in said District for a period of ten (10) years beginning in 2020 and ending with the year 2029, with collections from the levy of the tax estimated to be \$7,907,319.52 for one entire year, for the purpose of improving, maintaining, operating and supporting the hospital facilities of the Hospital Service District, including the acquisition of equipment and maintaining, expanding the District's Emergency Departments capabilities, and supporting the District's Therapeutic Riding program and Rural Health Clinic in Vinton and Hackberry, title to which shall be in the public. Mr. Delafield addressed the Council and stated that he should have incorporated the words "West Calcasieu Cameron Hospital Service District" into the agenda wording. A couple of citizens spoke in support of the resolution. Mr. Favre stated that he would abstain from voting since he works for the hospital. Motion was then made by Mr. Moss seconded by Mr. Bergeron that the following resolution be adopted to-wit:

BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Sulphur, Louisiana, the governing authority thereof, that they do hereby support the proposition to renew a levy and collect an ad valorem tax of 6.95 mills on all property subject to taxation in said District for a period of ten (10) years beginning in 2020 and ending with the year 2029, with collections from the levy of the tax estimated to be \$7,907,319.52 for one entire year, for the purpose of improving, maintaining, operating and supporting the hospital facilities of the Hospital Service District, including the acquisition of equipment and maintaining, expanding the District's Emergency Departments capabilities, and supporting the District's Therapeutic Riding program and Rural Health Clinic in Vinton and Hackberry, title to which shall be in the public.

The next item on the agenda is a public hearing on ordinance amending Chapter 5-21 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Sulphur to adopt the Louisiana State Uniform Construction Code. Motion was made by Mr. Moss seconded by Mr. Bergeron that the following ordinance be adopted to-wit:

ORDINANCE NO. 1530, M-C SERIES AS AMENDED

ORDINANCE AMENDING 5-21 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE
CITY OF
SULPHUR TO ADOPT THE LOUISIANA STATE UNIFORM CONSTRUCTION
CODE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Sulphur, Louisiana, the governing authority thereof, that they do hereby adopt the Louisiana State Uniform Construction Code for the City of Sulphur, relative to Article II. Building Code of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Sulphur, Louisiana; and to provide for related matters to read as follows:

ARTICLE II. BUILDING CODE

Sec. 5-21 -Uniform Construction Code adopted.

In accordance with the requirements set forth in R.S. 40:1730.28, effective July 1, 2017 (excepting the National Electric Code which is presently in effect), the following is hereby adopted as the Louisiana State Uniform Construction Code:

- (1) International Building Code (IBC), 2015 edition, not including Chapter 11, Accessibility, Chapter 27, Electrical. The applicable standards referenced in that code are included for regulation of construction within this city. Furthermore, IBC shall only apply to the International Building Code.
- (2) International Existing Building Code (IEBC), 2015 edition, and the standards referenced in that code for regulation of construction within this city.
- (3) International Residential Code, 2015 edition, not including Part VIII-Electrical. The applicable standards referenced in that code are included for regulation of construction within this city. The enforcement of such standards shall be mandatory only with respect to new construction, reconstruction, additions to homes previously built to the International Residential Code, and extensive alterations.
- (4) International Mechanical Code (IMC), 2015 edition, and the standards referenced in that code for regulation of construction within this city.
- (5) The International Plumbing Code, 2015 edition. The applicable standards referenced in that code are included for regulation of construction within this city. The enforcement of such standards shall apply to the erection, installation, alteration, repairs, relocation, replacement, addition to, use or maintenance of plumbing systems within this jurisdiction. This code shall also regulate nonflammable medical gas, inhalation and anesthetic, vacuum piping, nonmedical oxygen systems and sanitary and condensate vacuum collections systems. The installation of fuel gas distribution piping and equipment, fuel-gas-fired water heaters and water heater venting systems shall be regulated by the International Fuel Gas Code.
- (6) International Fuel Gas Code (IFCG), 2015 edition, and the standards referenced in that code for regulation of construction within this city.

(7) National Electric Code (NEC), 2014 edition. The standards referenced in that code for regulation of construction within this city.
