The next item on the agenda is Open discussion for the purpose of receiving public comment on the draft Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance. Tim Jackson, Planner from New Orleans, addressed the Commission and stated that the first zoning ordinance was voted on by Council in 2003. That ordinance currently has 6 districts. The new zoning ordinance will have 11 districts; 4 residential and 3 commercial. The ordinance and map will be placed on City's website as well as in the City Hall conference room and public library. There will be a third public meeting on February 25th at Frasch Park meeting room. Eventually Land Use will introduce the ordinance (probably March/April) and Council will hold public hearing the month after introduction. The ordinance will become effective a few months after the public hearing. Mike Daigle, Land Use Administrator, stated that this is a working document. We want to hear your concerns.

Bill LeBlanc addressed the Commission and stated that he doesn't want the Commission and Council to rush this. Last time the ordinance was adopted it was rushed through.

Ted Thompson, Maplewood Drive, asked if he could get a red-lined copy of all the changes from the current ordinance to the proposed ordinance. Tim Jackson stated that this isn't an amendment to the current ordinance, this is a whole new ordinance. The definitions are going from 2 pages to 14 pages.

Bill Morrison addressed the Commission and asked if the zoning ordinance will have anything to do with businesses making too much noise and disturbing the surrounding neighborhoods. Steve Villavaso, Planner, stated that maybe in the Industrial District they could put a noise ordinance clause.

Pam Richards, Harmon Street, addressed the Commission and asked if the construction on Prater Road will lower the property value. Mayor Duncan stated that Axiall told him that their expansion will not affect anyone's property value.

At this time Mr. Jackson stated that they would be available to answer questions after the meeting.

There being no further business to come before the Commission, the Chairman declared the meeting adjourned.
