regular meeting place in the Council Chambers, Sulphur, Louisiana, on June 27, 2016 at 5:00 p.m.,

after full compliance with the convening of said meeting with the following members present:

After the meeting was called to order and the roll called with the above result,

prayer was led by Marcus Wade, Faith Temple Church, followed by the reciting of the Pledge of

Allegiance led by Mr. Favre.

The first item on the agenda is a resolution accepting the Mayor's recommendation for the

appointment of a Fire Chief. Mayor Duncan stated that the committee interviewed several applicants

and their recommendation is to appoint Daniel Selph. His position becomes effective July 1, 2016.

The next item on the agenda is an	introduction of ordinance amending Ordinance No. 1362,
M-C Series which adopted a Work Force	Temporary Housing ordinance. Mr. Favre stated that there

were several meetings held with attorneys on this amendment. He asked everyone to review the amendments for the next two weeks and the public hearing will be held Monday, July 11, 2016. Randy Hebert, Live Oak, addressed the Council and asked what the amendments were. Mr. Favre stated that one of the changes is to remove City Council from approving the applications. The Permit Department issues permits on a daily basis and they feel that they can review the plans and release permits as needed. Another change was requiring a line of credit in place of a bond. Jay Delafield, bonding attorney, helped write this section and he feels this is appropriate. The rest of the changes are minor.

Dalton Langford, representative of Southland Field Airport Board, addressed the Council and stated that Council should be careful and not hand over their duties so quickly. City Council needs to vote on the applications. He's had personal talks with Cotton Logistics. They're very wealthy people and they'll run over small business people. Mr. Moss asked if Cotton Logistics did anything illegal to him. Mr. Langford stated that they didn't but they are very strong in the legislator and very competitive. Mr. Langford also stated that he and Mr. Ashy attended the same college and also the State Fire Marshal went to college with Mr. Ashy. He's dealt with these people and they've run all over citizens. They've never done anything to hurt me but to people I've dealt with. At this time Mr. Moss asked that everyone go over the redlined changes and let them know if they have any changes.

Ms. Allison stated that Council isn't handing over their duties. If Administration has a problem with anything in the ordinance Council will be there to address it. Council isn't turning their backs on anyone. Mr. Favre stated that the Permit Department will follow the process that's in the ordinance. Mr. Dupre, Fire Chief, stated that they'll follow the permit process and that's it.

A resident living near Prater Road addressed the Council and asked if the neighborhood would be notified once the project is permitted. This property is probably wetlands so what will

Council do about that. Mr. Dupre stated that it's not typical to let a neighborhood know when

permits are released for any project. If a permit is issued, that has nothing to do with wetlands. The

Corps of Engineers handles wetlands. Permitting doesn't supersede the Corps of Engineers. Mr.

Bergeron stated that the resident can turn their concerns into the Corps of Engineers if that's what

they want to do. After discussion, motion was made by Mr. Favre seconded by Mr. Moss that the

following ordinance be introduced:
