- (d) The placement of more than one (1) travel trailer, motor home and/or mobile home on one (1) residential lot shall be subject to further authorization only from the Land Use Commission and City Council;
- (e) The provisions of this ordinance may be utilized by the City to authorize for six months the placement of one travel trailer or motor home on a vacant lot in a mobile home park.
- (f) That the extension of a six (6) month temporary permit shall be subject to Administrative approval. An extension beyond one (1) year shall be authorized only by the Land Use Commission and City Council;
- (g) That the requirements of Article IV, Part 3, Section 1 and 2, regarding Development Standards shall be waived;
