A 12-inch Water line at the Corner of Beglis and Burton Street broke on Tuesday was repaired Today(03/27/2018). This caused a loss of pressure in an affected area.

The streets in the affected area are: Garth, N. Scott, S. Scott, Christie, Keith, N. Beglis, Hwy 90, Burton, Louis Alleman, Julie, Maxine, Anthony, Victoria, James, Michael, Smith and Tanker. If you were without water in this area and are not on the list, please take precaution to boil water before consumption.

Because of these problems, the water produced by our water supply system is of questionable microbiological quality.

Therefore, as a **precaution**, the <u>City of Sulphur</u> Water System is issuing a BOIL ADVISORY effective immediately. This BOIL ADVISORY is to remain in effect until rescinded by the <u>City of Sulphur</u> Water System.

It is recommended that all consumers disinfect their water before consuming it (including fountain drinks), making ice, brushing teeth, or using it for food preparation or rinsing of foods by the following means:

Boil water for one (1) *full* minute in a clean container. The one minute starts after the water has been brought to a rolling boil. (The flat taste can be eliminated by shaking the water in a clean bottle, pouring it from one clean container to another, or by adding a small pinch of salt to each quart of water that is boiled.)

Again, please be sure to disinfect your own water prior to consumption until you have been advised otherwise.

The <u>City of Sulphur</u> Water System will rescind this Boil Advisory upon notification from the Louisiana Department of Health that additional water samples collected from our water supply system have shown our water to be safe.
